Position Summary:

Community Homeworks is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization whose mission is to empower our low-income neighbors to maintain safe, sustainable, and dignified homes in Kalamazoo County. This is achieved through critical home repairs, homeowner education, and tool lending to foster self-sufficient and successful homeowners.

The Lending Tool Program Manager supports Community Homeworks by managing the organization's new lending tool program and volunteers. The new lending tool program will launch in mid-2024. This job involves direct contact and frequent interaction with our participants, volunteers, community partners and others who support our programs and services. This individual must represent Community Homeworks in a professional manner with exceptional customer service. This individual must excel at project management and be extremely organized.

Responsibilities:

Lending Tool Program Manager:

- Develop systems and processes to launch the organization's new lending tool program, including acquisition of program items, tool inventory management, and maintenance.
- Acquire the initial phase of lending inventory to align with the organization's education workshop curriculum.
- Develop a new volunteer orientation and training program.
- Prepare training and safety material for tools and supplies available to borrow.
- Recruit and train an inaugural team of lending program volunteers to help with checkout/in, maintenance of items, and participant training.
- Manage the lending program's marketing and outreach efforts.
- Partner with other community organizations to expand collaboration.
- Track and report on program outcomes and assist with data management.
- Assist with periodic booth and community outreach events.
- Assist with periodic education workshops and events.
- Develop and execute the organization's smoke and CO2 detector safety and weatherization basic home audit programs, utilizing the support from volunteers.
- Help ensure cleanliness and attractive appearance of lending storage areas.
- Help prepare for other hosted community events in the Community Homeworks' building



Perform other related duties as assigned by supervisor.

Minimum Qualifications

- Skilled at project management and execution.
- Highly organized and ability to multitask in a fast-paced environment.
- Self-starter and take demonstrates initiative.
- Must have excellent interpersonal communications skills, both one on one and in large groups.
- High school diploma or GED required.
- Minimum of 18 year of age, legally authorized to work in the United States.
- Pass criminal background and sex offender registry
- Ability to work a flexible schedule (limited evenings and weekends are required).
